



Objectives





Combined Measures I

Reasons for combination

- to better address identified needs
- better targeting of support
- simplification for administration and beneficiary

Programming requirements

- Implementation according to the rules for the individual measures
- co-financed expenditure attributed to the dominant measure
- based on sound intervention logic (ex ante evaluation, SWOT analysis/needs identification)
- Combination has to be justified (added value)

Combined Measures II

Possible combinations

- all complementary and compatible combinations of measures
- "measure" refers to the single articles of RD Regulation

Special focus on combinations including

- LEADER
- Art. 35 Co-operation measure (collective action)
- Advice, training and knowledge transfer
- Art. 17 Investment in physical assets (Integrated projects)



Thematic sub-programmes (TSP)

- Can also address climate change mitigation and adaptation
- separate SWOT analysis, needs/target identification and indicator plan
- 10% higher support rate for TSP related to climate change
- Management/implementation by intermediate bodies possible
- Examples:

"Manure Chain"

Advice on manure handling (Art. 15)

Climate Proofing of planned investments (under Art. 17)

Improved N-efficiency (Art. 28)

or

Precise N-application (Art. 17)

"Soil management for climate change"

Erosion Control Plan (Art. 15 or 18)

Expert Survey

- Target group: RD programme coordinators and experts
- **Objective:** Identify combinations of RD measures/operations which facilitate implementation and/or increase overall efficiency with focus on climate mitigation and adaptation measures
- Constraints: limited responses



Expert Survey: initial results

- Few experiences with implementation of combined measures, although combination of measures is considered useful
- Implementation mostly separately without using obligatory measure combinations
- Few examples for planned measure combinations
- No climate related thematic sub-programmes have been reported
- Both instruments are associated with increased administrative burden and are expected to complicate programming

Climate Proofing of planned investments (under Art. 17)

Carbon Audit/Climate Check (e.g. under Art. 15)

Investment in regional irrigation infrastructure (e.g under 17c)

Farm equipment for more efficient irrigation (under Art. 17a)

Investments for restoration of wetlands (natural heritage) (Art. 20 Basic services and village renewal in rural areas) Land consolidation (Art. 17c) Extensification on organic soils (Art. 28) Pilot Projects for Paludicultures (Art. 35)
